1. Strip Searching			
<p><u>When an inmate is to be strip searched</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - During admission into the prison - Before and after every visit - When inmates return from outside the facility - Whenever inmates return from working gangs - Upon suspicion of carrying contrabands 			
<p><u>Conditions of strip searching</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Always conducts the search with more then one officer - Does not strip search inmate in front of others - Does not conduct cross-gender searching - Asks the inmate to remove his clothes 			
<p><u>Strip searching</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Asks the inmate to open his/her mouth and checks inside - Asks the inmate to run his/her hand through the hair - Checks behind the ears, the feet, under the arm pits - Asks the inmate to stand with arms out stretched and legs apart - Carefully artificial limbs or any other aids - Asks a medical doctor to examine internal cavities if need be - RECORDS THE SEARCH
